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1	RESOLUTION ON RACE TO THE TOP
2 3 4 5	WHEREAS the federal government has issued the Request for Proposal for the competitive grant called Race to the Top; and
6 7 8	WHEREAS the grant sets forth requirements designed to support innovation in school reform; and
9 10 11	WHEREAS Race to the Top aligns with the reforms set forth by Ohio's House Bill 1 education reform package; and
12 13 14	WHEREAS local districts were asked to sign on to participate in the Race to the Top grant; and
15 16 17 18 19	WHEREAS those local districts, as represented by the Superintendent, School Board President, and the Union President, are required to sign a memorandum of understanding (MOU) that outlines what is mandated and recognizes the importance of maintaining collective bargaining rights; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS the participation in Race to the Top requires that all districts that signed on to Ohio's MOU secure the signature of the union president; and
23 24 25	WHEREAS the Ohio Federation of Teachers worked collaboratively with the state to create both the MOU and the final grant application; and
26 27	WHEREAS Race to the Top is largely seen as the precursor of the reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA); and
28 29 30 31	WHEREAS it is important that the districts demonstrate a collaborative environment in which those reforms can be enacted; therefore
32 33 34 35	BE IT RESOLVED that the Ohio Federation of Teachers (OFT) supports the implementation of the Race to the Top grant as a way to demonstrate research based practices to serve as models for the reauthorization of the ESEA; and,
36 37 38 39	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the OFT and the American Federation of Teachers provide technical assistance and support to its locals that have signed on to participate in the Race to the Top grant.

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39	RESOLUTION ON TEACHERS ON THE MODEL CURRICULA COMMITTEE
40 41 42	WHEREAS the Governor's Education Reform Plan calls for a model curricula based on the new standards; and
43 44 45	WHEREAS the new model curricula must be completed for adoption by March, 2011; and
46 47 48 49	WHEREAS the model curricula will be developed by committees that may not specifically require a majority of classroom teachers; therefore
50 51 52 53	BE IT RESOLVED that the Ohio Federation of Teachers (OFT) strongly recommends the inclusion of a majority of classroom teachers on the model curricula committees; and
54 55 56 57	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that these teachers on the model curricula committees be selected from candidates recommended by the Ohio Federation of Teachers and the Ohio Education Association.
58 59 60 61	RESOLUTION ON THE OPERATING STANDARDS FROM THE GOVERNOR'S EDUCATIONAL REFORM PLAN
62 63 64 65	WHEREAS the Governor's Educational Reform Plan delegates the development of operating standards for teaching and learning in the 21 st century to the Ohio State Board of Education; and
66 67 68 69	WHEREAS these standards are consistent with the teaching and learning standards promoted by the American Federation of Teachers and the Ohio Federation of Teachers and include a collaborative learning environment and shared leadership; therefore
70 71 72 73	BE IT RESOLVED that the Ohio Federation of Teachers commends the governor for his recognition and inclusion of such standards in his overall Educational Reform Plan; and
74 75 76	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Ohio Federation of Teachers support and promote such standards with all its members; and
77 78 79	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Ohio Federation of Teachers will work with its locals to implement such standards in the school districts represented by our locals.
80 81	RESOLUTION ON HOUSE BILL 1
82 83 84	WHEREAS expanded learning opportunities are essential in order to prepare students for success; and

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WHEREAS House Bill 1 requires school districts to offer all day kindergarten starting with the 2010-2011 school year unless they apply and are approved for a waiver; and
WHEREAS provisions in HB1 also promote that learning days will be added to the learning year beginning with the state reducing calamity days to three in the 2010-2011 school year; and
WHEREAS the state is encouraging enrichment activities that could include travel out of state and/or necessitate absence from school that would be enhanced by teacher support; therefore
BE IT RESOLVED that the Ohio Federation of Teachers (OFT) believes financia support should be provided for those school districts that are already having difficulty meeting their financial obligations; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the OFT believes that resources and support must be provided to teachers in order to expand the learning day in creative and innovative ways that engage students and make the day more meaningful.
RESOLUTION ON OHIO'S NEW LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS
WHEREAS House Bill 1 requires the development of a new licensure system; and
WHEREAS this system will offer four differentiated licenses to Ohio teachers; and
WHEREAS the system will include a four year resident license prior to obtaining a five year professional license; and
WHEREAS the system will also include teacher leadership licenses designed to allow teachers to take on different roles and responsibilities; therefore
BE IT RESOLVED that Ohio Federation of Teachers (OFT) advocates that any activities that are required for these licenses be meaningful and multi-faceted to meet the differentiated needs and experiences of the educators; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that OFT advocates that the state reviews successful programs that can serve as models which are currently in effect in American Federation of Teachers and OFT locals.

WHEREAS the Educator Standards Board has been required by the legislature to find a way to tie student achievement to educator licensure renewal; and

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133 134	WHEREAS a growth model measures a teacher's effectiveness more accurately than an overall student achievement score; and

136	WHEREAS there is not yet a fair, practical or proven way to tie student achievement to
137	the effectiveness of a teacher; and
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139	WHEREAS teacher effectiveness may not accurately be reflected in student
140	achievement tests as these assessments were never designed to be used as a teacher
141	evaluation tool; and
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143	WHEREAS many societal and home circumstances (such as poverty, poor health care,
144	tardiness and truancy) can powerfully influence a student's annual achievement and
145	may not be possible for one teacher to remedy; and
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147	WHEREAS students are more transient than ever and move from school to school
148 149	(sometimes within one year) and therefore it becomes very difficult to tie a student's achievement to one teacher; and

151	WHEREAS only core subject areas at specific grade levels are assessed and some
152	teachers and/or support staff are not tied to assessment results; therefore

154	BE IT RESOLVED that the Ohio Federation of Teachers (OFT) asks that the Educator

159	licensure renewal until there becomes a clear link between teacher effectiveness and
