ADULT WORKPLACE BULLYING

WHEREAS, bullying and psychological abuse occurs between people of any gender and sexual orientation, and all racial, economic, education and religious backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, we the members of the Ohio Federation of Teachers, believe that we deserve dignity, respect and justice in our workplace; and

WHEREAS, we define bullying as a pattern of coercive, insidious behavior used by one person to gain or exercise power and control over another person that creates a harmful work environment. Bullying exceeds what the victim considers to be appropriate and reasonable in the performance of their work such as rude, degrading, contemptuous, or offensive remarks – and may include emotional or psychological abuse; and

WHEREAS, we define "pattern" as the nature of the behavior, not the specific form of the behavior. Therefore, repeated unreasonable behavior may be a pattern of diverse incidents, often escalating over time, e.g., verbal abuse on one occasion, personal property intentionally damaged on another occasion, and subsequently being unreasonably threatened; and

WHEREAS, if Senate Bill 5 passes bullying is one strategy management will condone and manipulate to achieve their objectives to promote an anti-union atmosphere. Their continual denial that this abuse takes place and protection of bullies denies people their dignity, respect, justice and promotes union busting.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ohio Federation of Teachers and its members deem bullying and emotional and psychological abuse and the use of Senate Bill 5's union busting unacceptable; and

 BE IT RESOLVED, that OFT and its members continue to work for and promote dignity, respect and justice in the workplace; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the OFT develop a statement of opposition to bullying, emotional and psychological abuse; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the OFT assist locals in creating relevant contract

contract negotiations.

SCHOOL LUNCHES

language and encourage members to consider incorporation of such language in future

WHEREAS, students deserve access to high-quality, safe, and nutritious lunches while in schools; and

WHEREAS, lunches served in schools are mandated to meet nutrition standards established under the National School Lunch Act; and

WHEREAS, school lunches should promote good eating habits, foster good health and provide nutritious, well-balanced lunches for students; and

WHEREAS, many school lunch menu items consist of foods that are processed, high in saturated fat, sugar, and salt; and

WHEREAS, recent studies have shown that a high intake of processed foods or bioengineered foods are unhealthy; and

WHEREAS, a large percentage of students who receive free or reduced lunches and often depend on school lunches as their only daily meal are considered "at risk" for developing diet related diseases such as obesity, cancer, heart disease and diabetes.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ohio Federation of Teachers supports legislation that requires school districts to establish healthier school lunch menu options that encourage students to pick foods high in nutritional value.

INDOOR AIR QUALITY

WHEREAS, poor indoor air quality in schools and county agencies threatens the health and well-being of students, clients and employees; and

 WHEREAS, failure to properly maintain school and county heating and air conditions systems have been associated with the growing epidemic of sick air building syndrome and respiratory illnesses; and

WHEREAS, usage of cleaning products, chemicals and paints that emit volatile organic compounds have contributed to sick air building syndrome; and

WHEREAS, mold infestation and other indoor environmental hazards contribute to sick air building syndrome; and

WHEREAS, many schools and county buildings have outdated self contained heating and ventilating systems that do not provide an adequate supply fresh air to classrooms and work areas; and

WHEREAS, many district and agency administrators have not provided those who maintain indoor air systems with sufficient training opportunities to become proficient in the operation of heating, air and ventilation systems; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ohio Federation of Teacher locals encourage their school districts and county agencies to use green products and non volatile organic compound products; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that OFT advocate for legislation that requires school districts and county agencies to notify employees when actual and potential hazards exist and to complete corrective actions to eliminate the problems and report results in a timely manner, a

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that OFT advocate and encourage the enforcement of the current OSHA/ MOSHA laws.
