2011 Resolution

Senate Bill 5

1 WHEREAS, Ohio's collective bargaining law benefits both employers and workers by 2 managing expectations and goals; and

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4 WHEREAS, Ohio's collective bargaining law has reduced the number of strikes, and 5 has helped improve services provided to the public, and ensured safe and more well-6 prepared workers; and

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8 WHEREAS, if teachers lose their right to collectively bargain contracts, they lose the 9 ability to safeguard students by having a say in maintaining appropriate class size 10 and attracting quality teachers; and 11

12 WHEREAS, Senate Bill 5 will kill jobs and weaken middle class families in Ohio; and 13

WHEREAS, workers who use collective bargaining provide a wide range of necessary services; such as teaching our children, driving children to and from school safely, protecting and patrolling our streets, fighting fires, providing transportation for the disabled and elderly, plowing our streets, fixing our waterlines when they break in freezing weather, paving and maintaining our roads, collecting our trash; and

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WHEREAS, our teachers, police officers, firefighters, child protective service workers,
correction officers, school bus drivers, nurses, paramedics and other public workers
are also our neighbors, friends, family members, coaches, community volunteers,
ushers at church, and taxpayers - are part of the fabric of our communities; and

WHEREAS, corrections officers, bus drivers, water and sewer workers, educators, inhome caregivers and other public employees are also consumers in their communities spending their money on products and services that keep local merchants open, hiring and thriving; and

- WHEREAS, Senate Bill 5 will have such a devastating impact on all Ohio families;
 therefore
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- BE IT RESOLVED, that OFT calls on its members to mobilize the community and
 ourselves to save the middle class; and
