1 A MASK MANDATE RESOLUTION 2 WHEREAS, from the onset of the pandemic, our goal has been to continue to educate children 3 in the safest way possible, and 4 5 WHEREAS, our experiences with both remote and hybrid learning last year confirmed our long-6 held belief, that children are best educated in a face-to-face classroom environment, and 7 8 WHEREAS, we have consistently advocated for the use of CDC guidelines as the baseline for 9 safety decisions in our schools, and 10 WHEREAS, the CDC currently recommends that all students and staff wear masks in schools, 11 12 and 13 14 WHEREAS, COVID cases in children aged 5 to 17 increased 198% from the week of August 15 15 to the week of September 4, and 16 17 WHEREAS, since July, there has been a 2000% increase in cases among Ohio children, and 18 19 WHEREAS, the rate of COVID cases in school-aged children is increasing at twice the rate as 20 the rest of the population, and 21 22 WHEREAS, in Ohio school districts where masks are optional, there has been a 54% increase 23 of COVID cases as compared to 34% increase in school districts where masks are either required for all students or for K-8 students, and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, students with disabilities or high-risk health concerns are the most vulnerable, and 27 therefore the most likely to have their education disrupted this year or to face serious health 28 risks as a result of being exposed to COVID, and 29 30 WHEREAS, neither our schools nor local health departments have the capacity for timely contract tracing in schools where masks are not mandated, and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, students and staff who are not masked and not vaccinated are subject to 34 quarantine, resulting in lost learning time for students and lost sick leave time for educators, 35 and 36 37 WHEREAS, our students cannot afford to lose more learning time to this pandemic. 38 39 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ohio Federation of Teachers calls upon Governor 40 DeWine, with support of the Ohio General Assembly, to implement a statewide mask mandate 41 for K-12 schools, and 42 43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Ohio Federation of Teachers calls upon the 134th 44 General Assembly to table or vote down any bills that prohibit mask mandates, including HB 45 400 and SB 209, and 46 47 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the absence of the Governor implementing a mask 48 mandate, the Ohio Federation of Teachers calls upon local superintendents and boards of

education they deserve in a safe environment, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if staff capacity is an obstacle toward effective implementation of
a mask mandate, the Ohio Federation of Teachers calls upon school districts to use federal
funds to ensure that staffing is adequate.
